# ACTION ALONG THE STREAM

In 2017/18 planting was our biggest achievement. We focused on the area around Swinton Close. For our first working bee we created paths, barrowloads of mulch from the Auckland Council, to enable access. Next, we got rid of weeds: blue morning glory, tradescantia, acanthus (bear's britches), elephant's ear. At last on Sat June 30<sup>th</sup> – was it that long ago?! - we had a working bee, centred at Carole's house in Swinton Close and with the help of many of you and of other willing people, we planted 1200 plants: amongst them, cabbage trees, flax, muehlenbeckia, native grasses, manuka, kanuka, five fingers.

What we do know is that on our second pulse - Aug/Sept – many of our baits were untouched. Either this means the rats are asleep or they have gone. Please give us feedback on your view of where we are at with the rats. Our next pulse will run in November. An email will be sent to remind you to set traps etc. Anyone who needs additional baits and or stations and traps, please let me know in the final week of October.
