


Privets and pest plants

Our partners Te Ngahere have continued with their work on the weed species in our valley, concentrating on the newly planted areas in zones 1,2,3. Richard and his team have now given us an analysis of the privets in our valley.

We are attaching a map outlining the privets graded according to the difficulty in getting rid of them. 16 hours of Te Ngahere's spring maintenance will be allocated to controlling privets not requiring arborist control. Arborist control was due to take place before October when privet come into flower and become an allergen. However, due to delays in this year and to bird breeding in October, this will now take place in summer/ early autumn 2021. Property owners will be advised and consulted. Due to financial constraints this will be a slow process taking place over a few years, with constant work on any new seedlings.

If you visit the site, you will notice lots of rye grass growth. That has been planted, by Te-Ngahere, for natural moisture retention in the soil.

Report water quality issues

Don't forget to report any smells from the stream to 09 377 3107. Even if it seems that no action is taken, it is important that pollution in the stream or in any waters feeding into our stream or into which it feeds, are recorded. Without the data, nothing will happen.

Control pests

Please let us know if you are being bothered by rats or possums.

Our November pulse, the third for the year, is well under way. If you would like more baits, or traps or stations, please let us know. Also, if you would like a possum trap we can supply those. Don't forget that while baits cannot be left out indefinitely, traps can be working all the time.

Help the birds

Since lockdown many of us have noticed an increase in birdlife. One of our members has asked that we remind cat owners to make sure their cats have bells. Sadly we have found tiny feathers at the foot of trees in our neighbourhood. An ominous sign!
